NOCI uses the information for keeping track of populations and species ranges as well as for plant surveys and field trips. The MBCDC uses the reports for planning and assessment purposes and to gauge the health of ecosystems.

\*All species are evaluated and ranked by the MBCDC. A rare species would be ranked S1 (very rare), S2 (rare), or S3 (uncommon) throughout its range or in the province. Species that are rare or at risk may also be designated as extinct, extirpated, endangered, threatened or vulnerable under the Manitoba Endangered Species Act, which affords them certain protections.
